## SAFETY DEFINITIONS

## **A** WARNING

Indicates a potentially hazardous situation that, if not avoided, could result in death or serious personal injury.

Indicates a potentially hazardous situation that, if not avoided, may result in minor or moderate injury. It may also be used to alert against unsafe practices.

NOTE: Indicates a situation or action that can lead to damage to your snowplow and vehicle or other property. Other useful information can also be described.

Become familiar with and inform users about the warning/caution labels on the back of the blade and the instruction label on the headgear.





## SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Improper installation and operation could cause personal injury and/or equipment and property damage. Read and understand labels and the Owner's Manual before installing, operating or making adjustments.

## **A** WARNING

Lower blade when vehicle is parked.
Temperature changes could change
hydraulic pressure, causing the blade to
drop unexpectedly or damaging hydraulic
components. Failure to do this could result in
serious personal injury.

#### **A** WARNING

The driver shall keep bystanders clear of the blade when it is being raised, lowered or angled. Do not stand between the vehicle and the blade or within 8 feet of a moving blade. A moving or falling blade could cause personal injury.

## **A WARNING**

Keep hands and feet clear of the blade and A-frame when mounting or removing the snowplow. Moving or falling assemblies could cause personal injury.

#### **A** WARNING

Do not exceed GVWR or GAWR including the blade and ballast. The rating label is found on the driver-side vehicle door cornerpost.

## **WARNING**

To prevent accidental movement of the blade, always turn the ON/OFF switch to OFF whenever the snowplow is not in use. The control indicator light will turn off.

#### **A** WARNING

Remove blade assembly before placing vehicle on hoist.

#### **A** CAUTION

Refer to the Kit Selection Guide/Selection List for minimum vehicle recommendations and ballast requirements.

## PERSONAL SAFETY

- Remove ignition key and put the vehicle in park or in gear to prevent others from starting the vehicle during installation or service.
- Wear only snug-fitting clothing while working on your vehicle or snowplow.
- Do not wear jewelry or a necktie, and secure long hair
- Wear safety goggles to protect your eyes from battery acid, gasoline, dirt and dust.
- Avoid touching hot surfaces such as the engine, radiator, hoses and exhaust pipes.
- Always have a fire extinguisher rated BC handy, for flammable liquids and electrical fires.

## FIRE AND EXPLOSION

## **A WARNING**

Gasoline is highly flammable and gasoline vapor is explosive. Never smoke while working on vehicle. Keep all open flames away from gasoline tank and lines. Wipe up any spilled gasoline immediately.

Be careful when using gasoline. Do not use gasoline to clean parts. Store only in approved containers away from sources of heat or flame.

## **CELL PHONES**

A driver's first responsibility is the safe operation of the vehicle. The most important thing you can do to prevent a crash is to avoid distractions and pay attention to the road. Wait until it is safe to operate Mobile Communication Equipment such as cell phones or two-way radios.

#### **VENTILATION**

## **A** WARNING

Vehicle exhaust contains lethal fumes. Breathing these fumes, even in low concentrations, can cause death. Never operate a vehicle in an enclosed area without venting exhaust to the outside.

## **TORQUE CHART**

## A CAUTION

Read instructions before assembling.
Fasteners should be finger tight until instructed to tighten according to the torque chart. Use standard methods and practices when attaching snowplow including proper personal protective safety equipment.

## **INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS**

NOTE: For easier assembly and installation, vehicle and all snowplow components should be on a smooth, level, hard surface, such as concrete.


- 1. Remove the bumper by unbolting it at the frame. Retain fasteners.
- Push the passenger-side mount plate tight up against the bottom of the frame. Then, move mount plate forward until the front edge of the mount plate upright is approximately 2-1/4" from the back of the bumper plate. Clamp mount plate into place against the frame.




## **A** CAUTION

Use caution not to pinch, cut or drill through any wires or hoses running along the frame rails.


3. Using the holes in the mount plate as guides, drill four 17/32" holes through the inner wall of the frame.





- Insert two 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws with handles and 1/2" flat washers into the inside of the truck frame and out through the rear drilled holes. Attach a 1/2" locknut to each cap screw, and hand tighten.
- 5. Insert two 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws and 1/2" flat washers into the inside of the truck frame and out through the front drilled holes. Attach a 1/2" locknut to each cap screw, and hand tighten.
- 6. Bend or cut the ends of the cap screw handles protruding out from the truck frame to allow for proper bumper attachment.
- Repeat Steps 2–6 for the driver-side mount plate, making sure before drilling that both mount plates are the same distance away from the fronts of the bumper plates.

 Align the four holes in each side of the pushbeam with the holes in the mount plates. Choose the set of holes that will bring the pushbeam closest to the dimension shown below.



- 9. Attach the pushbeam to the mount plates using eight 1/2" x 1-1/2" cap screws. Place a 1/2" locknut on each cap screw, and fully tighten according to the torque chart.
- Fully tighten the fasteners securing the mount plates to the frame rails according to the torque chart.
- 11. If the air dam does not clear the pushbeam, remove or notch the air dam as needed.

NOTE: Only cut air dam notches high enough to clear the pushbeam. The air dam should remain as one piece.

12. Reattach the bumper using the original fasteners.

NOTE: After five to ten hours of snowplow usage, retorque all mount assembly fasteners.
